Emerging Smart Technologies and their impact on Supply Chains

Smart technologies are transforming the way businesses operate, with their effects being felt all along the supply chain. This workshop will provide a forum for the ISL community to explore 3 key themes:

- 1. *Understanding the ‘fit’:*** How are smart technologies being used in supply chains? What does a smart supply chain look like? What does this mean in practice?
- 2. *Risk and ownership:*** What risks and opportunities do smart technologies provide to supply chains? In the age of increased smart technology, who owns the supply chain?
- 3. *Collaboration vs consolidation:*** Are we likely to see more collaborative business models with many firms working together to provide SC solutions or will fewer large multinationals run supply chains in future?

- Time will be allocated to these breakout sessions to allow for networking opportunities
- Aim is to connect/reconnect with the ISL community and as well as kickstart ideas for collaborative research initiatives
